





# National bargaining agreement negotiations are underway

## The delegations are hard at work

The first seven negotiating delegations met during the week of 21-25 November. Elected representatives for the Technology Agreement, the Steel and Metal Agreement, the Mining Agreement, the Joint Metal Agreement, the Innovation and Chemistry Agreement, Chemical Plants and Teko worked through all the existing motions regarding improvements to the terms of these agreements.

# The Agreement Council says "yes"

The more than 200 representatives in IF Metall's Agreement Council that met on 14 - 15 November said "yes" to proposals for the common requirement of 4.4 percent included in both the Swedish Unions

within Industry's platform and within the LO coordination. The platform and the coordination also include special




initiatives aimed at the lowest-paid workers.

#### What happens now?

The negotiating delegations will continue their work to review all specific industry requirements and compile them by agreement area. Just before Christmas, IF Metall will exchange agreement demands with the employers. After the Christmas and New Year's holidays, the national bargaining agreement negotiations will resume. The delegations will meet and negotiations with the counterparties will begin.

## IF Metall's 37 agreements
